

INFORMATION ON YOUNG RESEARCHER GRANT

To celebrate the 20th Anniversary of the HKSEMR, the Council has decided to set up a "Young Researcher Grant" which will be offered initially for five years. The Society will put up a maximum of HK\$120,000 per annum to support any young researchers/ investigators who wish to carry out works in the following areas:

- 1. Overseas laboratory visit for the purpose of learning a research technique or carrying out experiments/studies essential to their research projects.
- 2. Original clinical research for the purpose of fulfilling the exit assessment requirements of higher physician training in the specialty of Endocrinology, Diabetes, Metabolism and Reproduction.
- 3. Each grant is worth a maximum of HK\$50,000.

Conditions:

- 1. The applicant must be a paid-up member (<u>except</u> overseas members) of the Society for more than one year.
- 2. The clinical applicants must gain his/her basic degree <u>no more than ten years</u> from the time of application.
- 3. Each year, the Society will receive applications twice, and they will have to reach the Society's Secretary by 30th April, or 31st October. An *ad hoc* committee appointed by the Council for this purpose will review the applications. The committee may require the applicant to attend an interview, and will make recommendation to the Council for consideration. The decision of the Council will be considered as final.
- 4. Within three months after the conclusion of the laboratory visit or research, the awardee should submit a report to the Council summarizing his/her work, and include a balance sheet and the relevant receipts showing how the money was spent. The awardee will then receive the grant to match whichever is less between the actual amount spent and the original sum as approved by the Council.
- 5. The awardee must present his/her work in the Annual Scientific Meeting of the HKSEMR.
- 6. The HKSEMR should be acknowledged in all publications that are derived from the work carried out with the financial support of this grant.
- 7. For the overseas laboratory visit, the awardee must return to Hong Kong at the conclusion of his/her intended period of stay.
